Student Athletes

You must earn at least 5 credits in the semester prior to your sport season in order to be eligible to participate.

Schedule Change Policy

Withdrawal from Courses – Students dropping any class after the second week of a semester, for any reason, will result in an "N" (if passing) or an "F" (not passing) on the transcript. The "F" will be computed into the student's G.P.A. Parents and students should be aware that any class dropped after the 4th week of the semester for any reason will automatically be recorded as an "F" on the transcript. The "F" will be computed into the student's G.P.A. The principal may grant exceptions.

On-line Course Selection Steps

1. Log into your student or parent portal at www.campus.boiseschools.org
2. Click on the left-hand link: "Registration: 2010-11 BHS"
3. Review your Individual Graduation Plan, current transcript, download pdfs of course lists, BSD handbooks, and graduation requirements, and this newsletter.
4. Click on "Course Search", type in name of desired class, click "Go"
5. Scroll down.
6. Click on "Request this Course" or "Request as an Alternate" box.
7. If you want to be in periods 1—6 only, you should have 12 classes selected. If you want a "0" or "7" hour class, you should have classes that have course numbers ending in either "0" or "7".
3. Make sure you pick both "A" (first semester) and "B" (second semester) classes. Example: for English 12, you should have 0727A English 12 and 0727B English 12, so that you have both semesters of this class.

The On-line Course Selection Portal closes on February 21st. After that time, contact your school counselor to change desired courses.
